Pastor's Page

Summer greetings Pines family,

What a summer it has been for us, so far! July was a month full of activities and opportunities for our family of faith. The month started out with our youth heading out on mission to Belize. I have heard some of the stories they've shared since being back, and they are filled with seeing and experiencing God's movement and amazing love. You should make sure you put Sunday, October 13th on your calendar when the youth will share their trip experiences during worship. One of the stories you might hear about is their experience of Hurricane Beryl as it struck Belize and how they got to experience the hurricane again as it hit Houston. Not many people can say they went through the same hurricane twice in different parts of the world.

Even though Beryl brought the Houston area incredible winds that caused multiple day power outages and downed trees across homes and roads that caused massive destruction, it also unintentionally brought with it great acts of love and service. This church family stepped up, once again, to provide support and love to our church family and beyond. We opened the doors of the church for our family of faith to find cool respite from the blazing heat during the day, places to charge devices, and even cots and couches to spend the night if it was needed. Because the church had electricity, we were blessed with an opportunity to house 60 members of Team Rubicon, a national disaster response team, for the whole month of July. By housing this team, we were able to provide a clean, safe, and cool place for the team to recover from its daily mission work within our community. These men and women are amazing volunteers who have an incredible heart for service.

I also saw and heard of other acts of service following the storm. So many of you with electricity opened your hearts and homes to multiple individuals, families, and pets in their greatest hour of need. You were the hands and feet... and air conditioning of God. You opened your heart up to your brothers and sisters in their greatest hour, or days, of need. No matter the situation you stepped up, and I am so thankful for your heart! This storm really helped me realize how valuable our building, our location, and our people are to our community in the midst of crisis. This made me think how can we be more available? A generator, that's how we can be available even when the church doesn't have electricity. If we had a generator to power the gym, we could be a cooling center in the summer or a warming center during an ice storm.

We could provide plugs to recharge devices. We could make space for staff to organize our response to the needs of our community, and we could provide a safe place for people to spend the night. Our reach to the community could grow even larger. To make this happen we would need to find a grant to pay the costs involved. If you know of any funding opportunities that would be willing to help us serve our community when it's in need, please let me know.

May we all continue to seek ways to serve and love our neighbors with the gifts Christ has given us.



STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

The June 2024 financial statements can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Total income received through June 30 was \$364,935 (55% of budget.) Pledge income was \$296,366 and unpledged income was \$27,327. Interest income has already exceeded the full year's budget in only 6 months. Total income is ahead of budget through first six months of the year.
- 2. Overall expenses were right on target at \$303,717 (42% of budget). Property income increased to \$43,412, which offsets gross property expenditures of \$130,401. Net property expenses are below budget through June.
- 3. Net income through June increased to \$61,218... continuing a great start for the first six months of the year.



> **Reflection- Carol Schneider** Peter raising the disciple Tabitha from the dead. Acts 9:36-43

I was not familiar with this story until it was the subject of my last Circle study for this year. The Study title is <u>People Encounter Jesus Through the Work of the Disciples</u>. Before this lesson I had not thought of any women as disciples.

Acts 9:36 "Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas." Tabitha was a Greek speaking Jew. I learned through the study that Tabitha is the only woman in the New Testament to be designated a disciple. Tabitha used her financial resources to support the widows in her community. She also opened the upper room of her home as a base for local and traveling Christians.

When she became ill and died, the widows she helped washed her body but instead of burying her, as was custom, laid her in a room. They sent for Peter (25 miles away, taking about 3 days). He came and raised her from the dead. Tabitha's beloved community intervened in her behalf. They had great faith in Jesus and did not lose hope. They believed in the power of God to do something inconceivable. They waited for Peter to resurrect Tabitha.

The problems of the widows became Tabitha's problems. She saw their suffering as her suffering. It was stated in the lesson summary that each one of us has the potential to impact many lives. Our goal is serving Christ, and the church should always be for others to flourish.

Isn't this what Stephen Ministry is all about? This passage encouraged me to become a Stephen Minister to help others flourish. Stephen Ministry is an opportunity to help on a one-to-one basis. It will be doing God's work through a ministry in which I am supported, supervised, and well trained. I am comforted knowing that God will be in it with me.

I will be allowing His will to be done through me. I am able to walk alongside someone, accepting and encouraging them, paving the way for God's healing.


Memories at Pines...
