Pastor's Page

Advent blessings to you,

Advent is a wonderful time of the year for many reasons, especially for the hope it brings as we wait for the birth of the Christ child. With the birth of our Savior the world gets a reset, a renewal, and an opportunity to reconnect with our Creator God. This reset, renewal and reconnection are important for a healthy faith and a stronger life as we live into the Kingdom of God. This is an opportunity we should celebrate and live into not only on Christmas day, but every day of our lives. The question arises during this Advent season, how do you renew and reconnect to your faith, your Creator God and to the many gifts God has given you?

Just a few weeks ago I was gifted with such an opportunity from The Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). I was invited to attend a conference called CREDO. This conference invites ministers to attend so they may cultivate wholeness — their spiritual, vocational, health, and financial well-being — to better serve the Church. Specially selected conference faculty guide participants in reflecting on and growing in these key areas, so that they can develop their leadership potential.

A CREDO conference becomes an intentional, Christ-centered learning community, as pastors share with one another their knowledge, experience, compassion, and care. In this way, CREDO helps us replenish our spirits and rediscover the passion that first animated our call to ministry.

Through a discernment and visioning process that is the hallmark of this seven-day conference, we had several opportunities to contemplate who we are and what we believe God may be calling us to become. During the conference, each pastor is asked to develop a personal CREDO plan, which helps to guide us when we return home and seek to implement the work of our minds and hearts in our ministries.

My CREDO plan centered around two of my favorite scriptures Matthew 25:34-36 and Micah 6:8. I took specific phrases from those scriptures to develop the framework of my plan. The three paragraphs below are that framework. How this plan is played out will be the topic of a future month's article.

I am a Created and Blessed Child of God who has been created to **do justice** by **feeding** those who are hungry both physically, emotionally and spiritually; to **give** living **water** to those who are thirsty; to **welcome** the outsider; to **care** for those who are **vulnerable**, and those whom people **avoid**; to **listen** to those **imprisoned** by the things of life.

I am a Created and Blessed Child of God who has been created to **embrace faithful love** of myself, others, and God.

Session Meeting Notes

The Session of Pines Presbyterian Church met on November 26, 2018. Here are some highlights:

- Called a Congregational Meeting on December 9, 2018, following worship, for the purpose of electing six elders to the Class of 2022 and one elder to fill an unexpired term on the Class of 2021.
- Approved changes to the Pines Wedding Booklet and wedding fee schedule to lower the cost of wedding for Pines members.
- Received a Motion regarding Faithful Engagement on the Issue of Climate Change. The motion was referred to an ad hoc committee for final drafting, including a congregational listening session in early January.
- Received a report from the Ruling Elder Commissioners to the November 17, 2018 meeting of the Presbytery of New Covenant. Actions taken at the meeting included approving an organizational plan for the presbytery and approving nine of 10 proposed amendments to the Book of Order.
