





The July 2024 financial statements can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Total income received through July was \$398,701 (55% of budget.) Pledge income was \$318,018 and unpledged income was \$30,807. Interest income has already exceeded the full year's budget in only 7 months. Total income is ahead of budget through first seven months of the year.
- 2. Overall expenses were right on target at \$380,840 (53% of budget). Property income has increased to \$46,743, which offsets gross property expenditures of \$159,454. Net property expenses are below budget through July.
- 3. Net income through July was \$17,861... continuing a good start for the first seven months of the year.

Stephen Ministry training has made a significantly positive influence on all of my relationships. I have learned the tools to greatly improve my listening skills. As I reflect on the Stephen Ministry process, the most impressive take aways for me were; servanthood as opposed to servitude, assertive behavior as opposed to aggressive or passive attitudes, confidentiality is paramount, healthy boundaries and caring visits are only about the care receiver.

The time with my trainers and fellow students over the past four months has been a blessing to all of us!

The basis of Stephen Ministry is that the Holy Spirit is always with us and that we are the caregiver and God is the cure giver!
